| | CC explained the data/attainment not as good as Reception/data is based on 83% not 89% as SEN children not included. Interventions were impacted by staff absences Jan –Mar 22 (eg: 13 staff members absent at one time) TA's were moved to Rec to cover as due to ratio. <u>Reading</u> Year 1 children are still recovering from the impact of Covid and loss of learning during their EYFS education The attainment of pupil premium children is lower than all children EAL children are achieving broadly in line with all children There is no significant difference between the attainment of girls and boys Progress is in line with autumn progress | |

Actions/enquiries

- CC explained that the Learning Enrichment Programme to shift from reception to Y1 – to provide support going forward into Y2
- > Reading books are now being able to be taken home implement in Spring 22
- > Awaiting clarity on Tutoring Programme for next year
- > CC is confident that an improvement will be seen in the summer term.
- Literacy Scheme for 6 weeks this summer Parental responsibly school to advertise.
- Committee suggested that any home learning eg: Words, Curriculum Maps, Vocabulary sent out to Y1 as early as possible ready for Y2.
- > CC explained that Revision Packs are distributed during parental consultations.
- > Written Reports distributed in summer term.
- Committee enquired how pupil allocations were made at admission process CC explained the process.
- Committee suggested that information encouraging parent/carer to visit local libraries with their children.

YEAR 2

CC explained the data and that it is the first full year for Y2 due the pandemic Tutoring focus – Writing & Reading – in groups of 6 with Mrs Bharadia Writing & Reading Shed being used daily - very successful - currently a Castle Theme – previously a Jungle theme

JHS indicated that the data was very similar to last year.

<u>Reading</u>

- > Attainment of all pupils is significantly lower than last year
- Girls attainment is significantly higher than boys
- > The attainment of PP children is lower than all pupils

<u>Writing</u>

- > Attainment of all pupils is significantly lower than last year
- > Girls attainment is significantly higher than boys

| | | Maths Attainment of all pupils is significantly lower than last year Boys attainment is broadly in line with the girls attainment The attainment of PP children is lower than all pupils Actions/enquiries JHS suggested the school to advertise available online platforms. CC confirmed this is in place but the same cohorts tend to be the same pupils that always use the platforms and the pupils that need them do not. JHS enquired if there is any comparable data to similar settings available? CC confirmed that there was not. CC explained what areas Ofsted focus on to the committee. Y2 SATS going ahead, however results are not recorded centrally – Teacher Assessment data is forwarded onto the Y3 setting. | |

| 5. | Update on SDP 2022 - 2023 | The plan had been circulated ahead of the meeting, CC explained the areas in detail, and noted the new curriculum for PHSE and the adjustments to EYFS which are going very well so far. The school currently has a Bronze award for Healthy Schools – CC explained the plan is to still obtain as Silver award going forward. CC detailed The Elsa Programme on emotional development and it is operational. Scrap Books are in place – plan to provide these at the next GB meeting for members to look at. Music Curriculum is in place. CC has observed lessons and explained the processes in detail. SLT currently reviewing the Behaviour Policy and how beneficial is Golden Time and is there a need to change/adapt going forward. CC explained that other strategies were being discussed and welcomed any suggestions the committee may have. Autism Training in place for all – CC explained the increase in children being diagnosed and the possible reasons for the increase. CC explained the strategies in place for these children and parents can adapt these strategies to use at home too. | |

CC detailed roles/responsibilities of Mrs Bharadia for KS1 and Mrs Hare for Reception (interventions) Interventions will help to fill any learning gaps CC confirmed previously that some tutoring funding may need to be refunded to the borough if less pupils are on receipt of the funding provided – no update on this to date – CC is hoping for the availability of additional funding going forward. | |
