END of KS1 Results

<u>reading</u>

Cohort of 70 pupils

- 54% achieved the expected standard in Reading. This is significantly lower than 2021 and well below Barnet and National. 13% of pupils achieved greater depth in reading, lower than in 2021 and below the Barnet and National.
- 42% of pupil premium achieved the expected standard in Reading a significant decrease from 2019. 10 of the 19 pupil premium children were SEN.
- Girls did slightly better than boys, 58% compared to 51% reached the expected standard for reading.
- 50% of EAL children achieved the expected standard in reading compared to 80% of children who had English at a first language. (12 children joined year 2 with limited or no English)

Actions

- Continue to identify the Pupil premium children on the planning and target support.
- Phonics focus- more opportunities to target support at those children finding phonics challenging
- Ensure that all children read every day particularly those pupil premium children.
- Continue to use visuals to support children who have English as an additional language.
- Create packs for new arrivals that TA's can use to support the children
- Once each half term teachers to demonstrate reading to parents during the Friday morning reading session.

• Video demonstrations of effective reading strategies to be put on school website. Writing

- From a cohort of 70 pupils, 50% achieved the expected standard in Writing a significant decrease from 2021, this is below the percentage for Barnet and National.
- 39% of pupil premium achieved the expected standard in writing a slight increase from 2021 and more or less in line with national.

	 61% of girls achieved the expected standard in writing which is in line with Barnet and the national. Boys achieved significantly lower in writing with 41% of them reaching the expected standard. Actions Continue to identify the Pupil premium children on the planning and target support. Continue to ensure that we create writing opportunities that inspire boys. Continue with parent writing workshops. Maths 59% achieved the expected standard in Maths which is below the local authority and national. 58% of girls achieved the expected standard in Maths compared to 59% of boys. However the percentage of girls achieving greater depth in Maths (16%) was higher than boys (8%) 42% of pupil premium achieved the expected standard for Maths lower than Barnet and national 80% of pupils with English as their first language achieved the expected standard in Maths compared with 50% of pupils that have English as an additional language. Actions Ensure that children's gaps in Maths are identified and planning adjusted accordingly. Maths workshops for parents
